



2022-2023 Risk Reduction Plan

To support the implementation of the Bushfire Management Area Plan within the Fire and Emergency Services Act (2005) and maintain consistency with ISO31000 2019.

The Limestone Coast Bushfire Management Committee (LC BMC) provides the following:

1. Overview

Agencies and Councils were invited to contribute to the LC BMC Risk Reduction Plan (RRP) for 2022-2023 financial year. The LC BMC RRP is based on the delivery of actions outlined in the LC Bushfire Management Area Plan (BMAP).

LC BMC member agencies with assets rated as Very High & Extreme in the current BMAP were asked to identify which treatment strategies would be planned for implementation. It was emphasised that this RRP is for the upcoming twelve months only (2022-2023 Financial Year) and is not a full review of the BMAP.

There are agencies that enact policy or advise industry best practice. Due to the BMAP focus on on-ground delivery some agencies may not have any assets/treatments listed against them, therefore they have been exempt from being required to report against the LC BMC RRP.

This plan is a first endeavour to empower BMCs to undertake a planned and coordinated approach to the mitigation of bushfire risk. It is acknowledged that capacity and capability varies across all member agencies which emphasises the collaborative purpose of BMC's to address existential and landscape risk.

The intent of the 2022-2023 LC BMC RRP is to form the basis for the 2022-2023 Annual Report. Member agencies will be able to report against the complete and non-complete status of asset treatments rated Very High and Extreme and provide reasoning as to any challenges / constraints witnessed over the year (e.g. resources or weather conditions impacting delivery).

2. Agency Submissions

Within the LC BMC, one member organisation and two State Government Agencies completed the reporting template.

Some State Agencies chose to provide a single state-wide report being that they have presence over more than one BMC. Where appropriate during the workshop they were able to provide further information and collaboration treatments.

While agencies were asked to report against Very High and Extreme assets within the BMAP it also needs to be highlighted that there are areas within each agency that are business as



usual actions being undertaken for those assets lower than Very High that are not being captured for this iteration of the LC BMC RRP.

2.1 – Single Organisation Actions

Each agency from within the LC BMC was asked to submit their risk reduction plan for the 2022-2023 financial year.

Attached is a collated spreadsheet of all Plans received from those agencies that submitted information by the required date. Where no formal submission was received from an agency, and as communicated to the LC BMC, assets rated as Very High and Extreme have been included on their behalf.

2.2 – Coordinated Actions for next 12 months

A workshop was conducted within the BMC Meeting held in August 2022 where agencies were requested to submit assets of interest that their agencies intend to prioritise for the 2022-2023 LC BMC RRP.

Discussions were then held in regard to potential areas of coordination and collaboration between agencies.

Below is the table of coordinated activities created from the discussions held at the LC BMC meeting in August 2022.

3. Reporting Activities

Agencies were asked to report on the proposed risk reduction activity for each asset assigned to their area that are Very High/Extreme. Most agencies chose to report on the activity as a broad statement not identifying kilometres/hectares for hazard reduction or number of proposed s.105F hazard reduction compliance (s.105F) Notices to be issued.

Collated data on the number of assets highlighted in the collated LC BMC RRP 2022-2023 is as follows.
